“The next day, June 6, about an hour before George Jones and The Jones Boys were scheduled to take the stage for their matinee performance, The Rolling Stones arrived at the venue. They proceeded to the large first-floor dressing room that George and his band had occupied the day before. Surprised to find the dressing room in use, someone from The Stones' small entourage, likely U.S. Tour Manager Bob Bonis, asked Don, "Why are you in this dressing room? This is our dressing room."

Don, unsure of who the group of men was, stood up and walked toward the door. "Who are you?" he asked.

Bonis, looking a bit surprised, replied, "These are The Rolling Stones. They are the featured act today and tomorrow."

"George Jones is the star of this show," Don said.

"Your dressing room is upstairs."

Big Arnie, who was sitting on a sofa pulling on his boots, made eye contact with the intruders and pointed to the ceiling, indicating that they should indeed go upstairs. There was a brief, uneasy silence before The Rolling Stones turned around and started up the steps to the second floor.”

interview questions

What inspired you to tell this story?

Don Adams said, “Eric, we need to write a book about the Notorious Adams Boys, and I want to tell it all.”

I asked him why he wanted me to write it.

He said, “Because you’re from Greenfield. You’ll understand. “

That hit me like a truck because I immediately knew what he meant. I told him I would think about it and discuss it with my wife. In reality, I had already told myself I would do it.

Don was 84 years old and battling cancer. He deserved to have his story told. I was honored and humbled that he trusted me to do it.

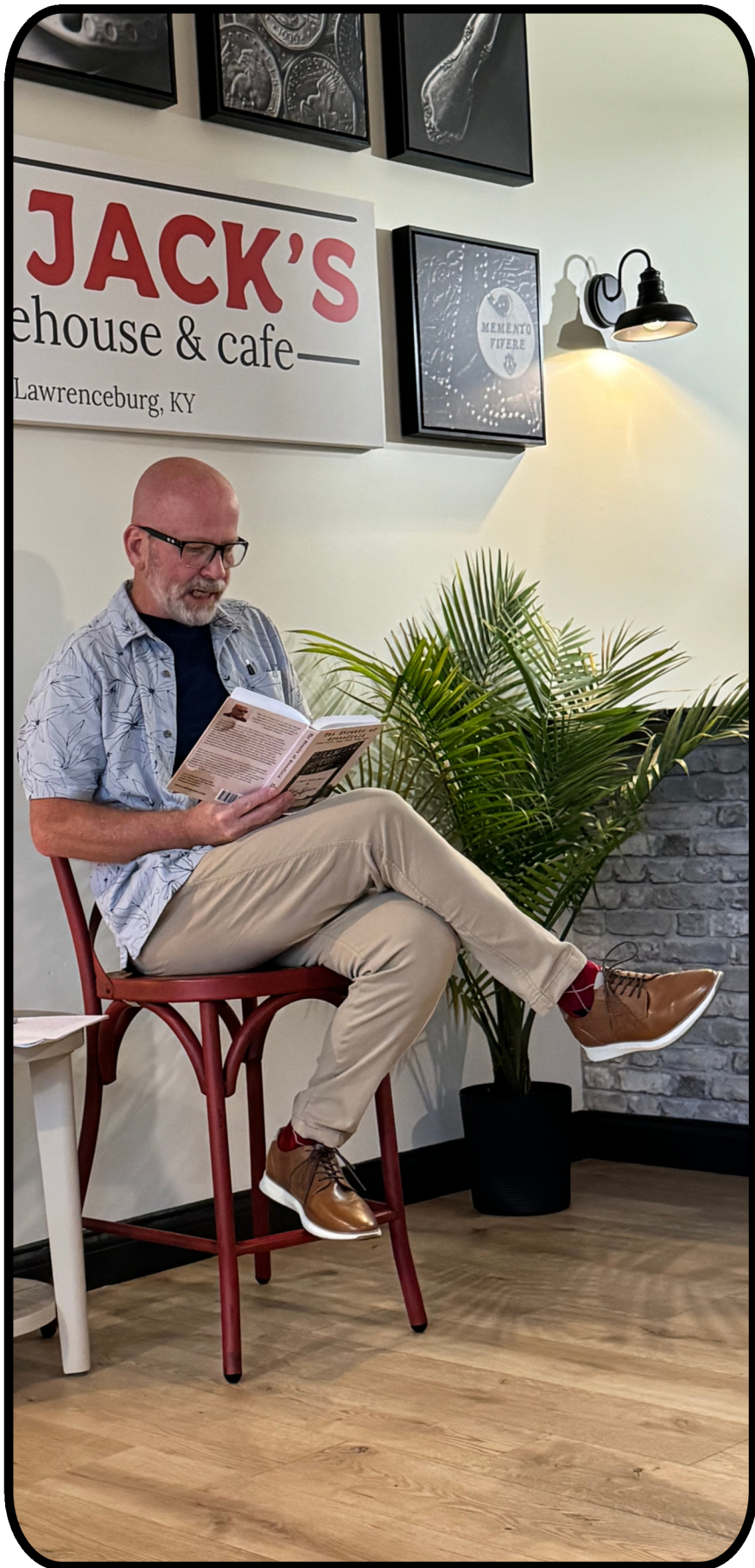
What surprised you most during your research?

The scarcity of photos taken by the three Adams brothers. Those guys simply didn't take many photos. Perhaps they didn't want to compromise themselves.

I was also surprised by just how well-known and respected the Adams Boys were within the world of Country Music. Literally everyone in Nashville knew them, or knew of them, from the mid-1960s to the early 1990s. Today, they have reached legend status.

What do you hope readers take away?

Fear of trying often keeps us from striving to accomplish what we really want in life. It causes us to accept what comes easily, even if it is counter to every instinct we have. These guys had no fear, and they were not about to compromise.
